BURSARIES 2024

Students graduating from High School in 2024 who are the sons, daughters, spouse of members or members of CUPE Local 561 shall be eligible if member has **attended not less than 50% of the regular Union meetings during a twelve-month period - May 2023 to April 2024 inclusive**, may be eligible for a General Bursary in the amount of \$350.00 to attend a post secondary institution. The Elizabeth McKnight Trades Bursary and Colin Gray Trades Bursary in the amount of \$500.00 are for applicants attending an accredited Apprenticeship Training Program or Trade School. *In order to be considered for a Bursary you must stay for the duration of the each meeting (approx. 2hrs). Deadline to apply for a bursary is May 1, 2024. Please check the website for more information.*
