#### Library:

- Unit meeting on January 17<sup>th</sup>.
- Will discuss new voting procedures, talk about bargaining and update members about two grievances going on. As well as new Page/Security position and then have a general discussion session for members to bring up questions and issues.

#### Transdev:

- We had some complaints that the paddles are missing things like post trips and other items like information about transfer vehicles. They are working on this right now. But until this is all corrected, please put in for any loss of money owed. We have also filed a grievance on these paddles for breaking the CBA not maximizing the 4 day 10 hour shifts.
- We recently had an employee wrongfully dismissed. We instantly grieved this action, and we were able to overturn this action and the employee is back working with us.
- We have finally finished a year old grievance. We won that grievance also and were able to get what was deserving of this employee.
- Drug and alcohol policy grievance. This has been moved to arbitration and our lawyer has been pressing the employer to set dates.
- Preventable accidents policy grievance. There will be a step 3 grievance meeting next week as well.
   The union believes the policy is unreasonable, arbitrary, and breaches a number of collective agreement articles.
- Old post trip grievance. After agreeing on the post trip of five minutes, the union finally received an
  offer from the employer for the post trip grievance. The amount was far less than what the union
  would agree to. The union has made a counter offer and waiting for a response. We are expecting it
  very soon.
- 25 new Transdev members certified on Thursday. Office employees and transit supervisors.
- We have a new GM starting Monday. We have not been told who he is yet and Chilliwack has also a new operational manager. His name is Harmeek Sarpal. Some of you may already know him. He was a Transit Supervisor in Abbotsford.
- Potential unit meeting to be scheduled for Sunday February 9th. Please mark your calendars.
